

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 14: 1, 7-14

Once I was invited to a group meeting with Pope Francis. Entering the room, I paused, eyeing the seats next to the Pope's fancy chair. Someone saw my paralysis and invited me to sit in the seat farthest from what I wanted. Hiding my disappointment, I sat. We waited. To our surprise, an aid pointed out that those seats were still empty and invited me and another to have them. We calmly but gleefully strode across the room and sat. Pope Francis entered, and we enjoyed two hours of amazingly uplifting conversation.

Jesus says this week to us: *“When you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, ‘My friend, move up to a higher position.’ Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table” (Luke 14:10).* This is not about how to score free seat upgrades. Rather, it is a wise pattern for the whole of life. It is how to live free from the anxiety of constantly grasping for status and recognition.

Jesus perfectly embodies his seat-taking advice. He eschews his glorious throne for the lowest: death on a cross, that lonely chair we all deserve. In his resurrection, he calls us up higher to his marvelous banquet seats. This week, perhaps we should look for opportunities to choose the lowest seat. We'll be pleasantly surprised when we do. — *Father John Muir* ©LPI



Devotions, Explained!

Imago Divina

Imago divina (Latin for “divine image”) is an extension of the ancient practice of lectio divina (“divine reading”). Imago divina is, in a sense, praying with one’s eyes, or using the medium of artwork to assist in lifting the mind to God.



Believers have always connected with the divine through visual representations of faith. This can be seen in the frescoes that adorn the walls of the catacombs, in the glory of Rococo architecture, and in the stained glass windows of a simple country church. “Art is capable of making visible our need to go beyond what we see and it reveals our thirst for infinite beauty, for God,” said Pope Benedict in 2011.

In practicing imago divina, just like with lectio divina, the faithful “read” (or view), reflect, respond and rest with the image, inviting the Holy Spirit to move them accordingly. ©LPi

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese and St. Vincent Pallotti Parishes:

We are writing to update you on the collaboration between St. Therese Parish and St. Vincent Pallotti parishes that began in October 2022. As reported in a May 14, 2024 letter to members of both parishes, since our collaboration began, we have successfully brought our Standing Committees together, our music and some of our liturgical efforts together and finally, in August 2024, we created a Combined Parish Council with one Strategic Plan. We have also collaborated on Religious Education, Feast Days and Holy Day celebrations. As a result of our efforts so far, we have been able to make better use of our resources, including our volunteers.

The recent retirement of St. Vincent Pallotti's Parish Secretary, Lori Gabert, created an opportunity for further collaboration. Heather Goeden, the Director of Administrative Services at St. Therese Parish, has agreed to assume the Parish Secretary responsibilities at St. Vincent Pallotti in addition to her current responsibilities as Director of Administrative Services at St. Therese Parish.




