The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

John 6:37-40

I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn't find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today's Gospel (John 6:37-40), he says, "This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me." Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the Father has given him. He searches for every lost soul — as the shepherd leaves the ninety-nine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin — and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost.

On All Souls' Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in his loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. Of what the Father gives him, he loses nothing. — *Father John Muir* ©LPI

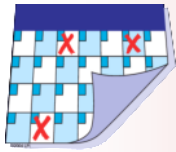

St. Therese Sharing Weekend is Next Weekend – November 9

This month's Sharing recipient is the Milwaukee VA Fisher House. The Fisher House is located on the Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center campus. The Fisher House's mission is to provide a "home away from home" for the families who need to be at the bedside of ill or injured Veterans or Service Members. The Milwaukee Fisher House is just over 13,000 square feet that features 16 private suites with walk in showers, gourmet kitchen, laundry room, dining room, office and family room. Through donations we are able to keep the kitchen fully stocked with food, snacks and drinks, as well other resources for the families that stay here. Families can stay at the Fisher House for as long as the veteran is admitted, free of charge. Veterans from all over Wisconsin, Michigan and Illinois come to the VA hospital in Milwaukee for much of their health care needs. When those families, traveling more than 50 miles, need a place to stay, the Fisher House is there for them.

There are many ways to help get involved with the Fisher House here in Milwaukee. One popular way is by preparing meals for the families that are staying. From The Earth Ministry: Worldwide Transition to Clean Energy



In a recent bulletin article we cited the health and economic benefits determined for Wisconsin by our transition from fossil fuels to renewable sources for generating electricity. That article is a great segue to the fact that worldwide, for the first quarter of 2025, renewable sources (34.3%) surpassed coal (33.1%) for power generation. This is a historic milestone! Populous developing countries like China and India made the largest gains in generating electricity from renewable sources. Hungary, Pakistan and Australia also made significant transitions from coal. While the US is also making gains, increasing demand leaves renewables struggling to meet consumer needs. Nonetheless, every step taken reduces the harmful effects of climate change, so we encourage you to support all efforts to reduce reliance on fossil fuels for electricity generation and transportation needs.

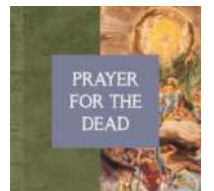
We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2 each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the antechamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. We can also remember the departed in our daily prayers. Just as we have special intentions for family and friends here on earth, we can pray for those who have died. It's also a good act of Christian charity to pray for the forgotten, those who have no one else to pray for them. God knows who they are! ©LPi

Devotions, Explained! – Prayer for the Dead

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ. Prayer for the dead is a practice which not only predates Catholicism but predates Jesus Christ, as we see in the Second Book of Maccabees (*2 Maccabees 12:42-45*).

“By virtue of the ‘communion of saints,’ the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf,” says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055). The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: “Eternal rest grant unto them, o Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace.” ©LPi

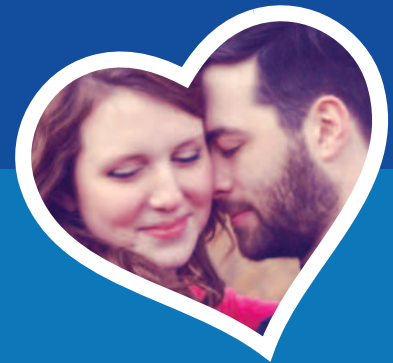
