The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

When I was ten, my dad gathered our family around the table in small-town Vermont and told us we were moving to the big desert city of Phoenix, Arizona. We were leaving behind family, friends, and everything familiar. None of us knew what to expect.

But something beautiful happened. As we made the move together, our family grew closer. In retrospect, I'm amazed at my parents' courage to go on that adventure. Even as a kid I realized our family found, in that challenge, a deeper unity and mutual love.

In today's Gospel, Joseph is told: **“Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee...” (Matthew 2:13, 20)**. First to Egypt, then later to Israel. The Holy Family is frequently challenged to move and change, to adapt to God's will for them, in order to find safety in the midst of threat. It's not just an idiosyncratic story about survival. It's a spiritual pattern for all of us. Every Christian family is called to be a kind of sanctuary, especially in a world full of noise, busyness, and fear.

May I make a practical application for us? The Lord's Day, Sunday, is perhaps the most practical way we imitate this dynamic we see in Joseph and his family. Sunday is not meant to be just like every other day, filled with errands and stress. It's meant to be a day set apart; a holy “escape” into rest, worship, joy, and peace. A day to rise, take your family, and flee, into God's presence. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

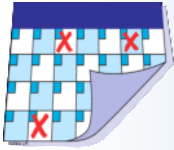

From The Earth Ministry:

Reduce / Recycle Holiday Refuse Between Thanksgiving and New Year’s Day, American household



waste increases by more than 25 percent! Cartons and boxes, other packaging material, gift wrap and greeting cards account for most of this.

Cardboard-based boxes and cartons are recyclable, but Styrofoam and similar packaging used to secure items inside them is not. Gift wrap (excluding foil) and cards are also recyclable, but you must first remove any glitter, bows, ribbons or adhesives. As an alternative to purchased gift wrap, some families put their artistic talents to work by decorating wrap made from paper bag material. Others actually use the colorful Sunday funnies as their preferred wrapping paper.

Better yet, avoid wrapping gifts entirely by placing small gifts (gift cards purchased through our SCRIP program are perfect!) in Christmas stockings, or conceal them within a scarf or Holiday-themed dishtowel. Also, you can re-use purchased gift bags you’ve received and saved (the epitome of “re-gifting”!). Some creative folks also make “Christmas Bags”, personalized for friends and family members. Over the years, the reuse and exchange of these bags becomes part of their Christmas tradition.

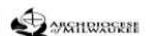

Plastic Bags for Mercy Mats

Just a quick reminder that we still collect plastic shopping bags to create Mercy Mats for the homeless. The bags are folded, cut into strips and then looped together to create PLARN (plastic yarn) that is then crocheted to make the mats. Because they are plastic, moisture is kept away from the body. They are big enough for a grown man to sleep on.

You may drop them off at the entrance of all three churches where they will be picked up by a member of the Human Concerns committee. Thinner grocery bags work best. The thick Sendik’s bags unfortunately don’t work well for this project.

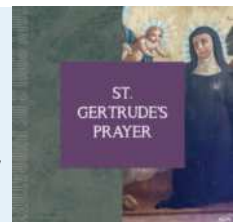
Devotions, Explained!

St. Gertrude’s Prayer

St. Gertrude’s Prayer is a petition said on behalf of the Holy Souls of Purgatory, offering the Blood of Christ in reparation for the sins of the departed.

St. Gertrude, often called “St. Gertrude the Great,” was a Benedictine nun who lived in 13th-century Saxony, present-day Germany. A mystic, she received visions of Christ beginning at the age of 25. She was also a prolific writer and devotee of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and is often invoked as an intercessor for the Holy Souls of Purgatory. Her feast day is celebrated on November 16.

The St. Gertrude Prayer reads: “Eternal Father, I offer You the most precious blood of thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, for those in my own home, and in my family. Amen.” ©LPi



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton | January 4th

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774–January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph’s Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter’s Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of “saint.”©LPi

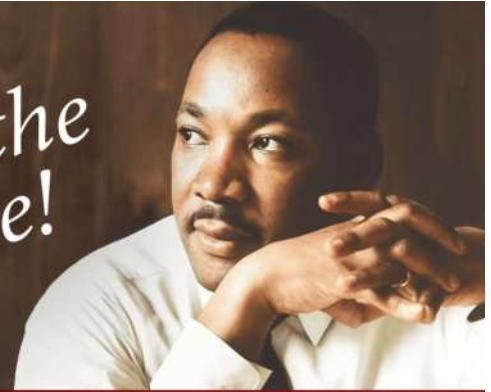

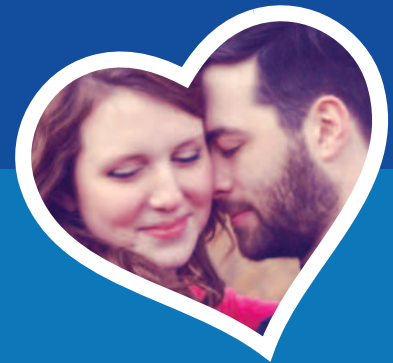
