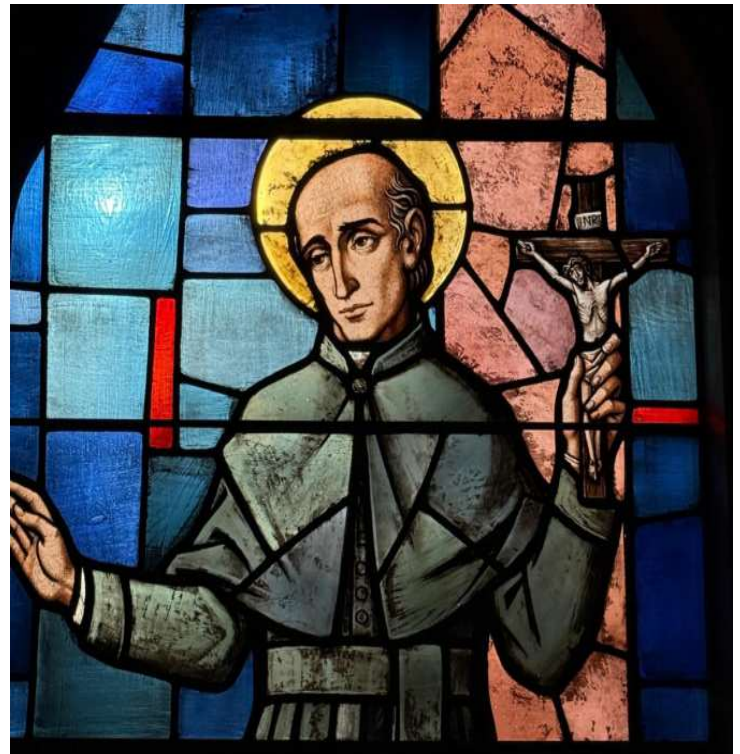

The Feast of St. Vincent Pallotti

St. Vincent Pallotti was born in Rome, April 21, 1795. From his earliest years his devout parents took him to daily Mass and religious devotions in the many neighborhood churches of Rome. For a time Vincent had trouble with his studies until his mother sought the advice of a close friend, Father Fazzini. He advised her to make a novena to the Holy Spirit with Vincent. The Novena completed, something clicked in the boy's head. He became the brightest student in his class.

As Vincent neared ordination he was introduced into apostolic work among the farmers who brought their products to Rome from the surrounding towns and villages to sell at the markets. Vincent was assigned to the hay sellers. He organized the young farmers and their children into classes in the evening and helped them to learn how to read and write. He also prepared many of them for the sacraments. From this experience of being a volunteer, he would later encourage others to volunteer to spread the kingdom of God. He began a very successful apostolate of street preaching on the steps of local churches and was able to attract large numbers of people into church afterwards for confession.

His knack for getting volunteers involved in his many projects, expanded beyond his concern for youth when he began to broaden his vision of the Union of the Catholic Apostolate (UAC) which strove to accomplish a revival of the Catholic faith among Catholics and a rekindling of charity toward achieving the salvation of one's neighbor.

St. Vincent Pallotti died in 1850 surrounded by a handful of followers which now numbers thousands of priests, brothers and sisters and an even more vast number of lay people committed to the apostolate. Vincent's missionary zeal brought the Pallottines to the United States in the early 1880's and to the Midwest Province headquartered in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1923. He was canonized in 1963 by Pope John XXIII as a model for all active priests and for encouraging the lay people to become more active in the mission of the Church. Also, he was hailed by Popes Pius XI, Pius XII and John XXIII as the precursor of Catholic Action and of the Second Vatican Council. 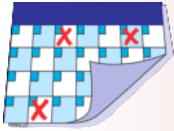

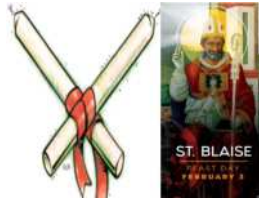

Standing Committee Monthly Reports

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) met on January 7 and these are the key items discussed at the meeting:

- The PPC reviewed the status of the preparation for the Town Hall meetings to be held February 7 and 8, 2026 following the 4:00PM Mass at St Vincent Pallotti West and the 9:00AM Mass at St Therese.
 - The Ad Hoc Communication Committee will schedule a meeting in the next week or so to make sure everything is ready for the Town Hall meeting presentation.
- PPC reviewed the Annual Plans submitted by the Standing Committees for the Fiscal Year which begins July 1, 2026.
 - The plans were approved.
 - PPC requested that Christian Formation create opportunities for families to attend Reconciliation during Lent and Advent to gain the graces that are received from that sacrament.
 - Committees will be advised of their Annual Plan approvals.
 - The council and committees should consider a more evangelistic focus in planned activities within our parish communities. This is needed if we are going to grow our parishes.
 - Standing committees can now begin the budget process for next fiscal year based on the approved Annual Plans.
- The PPC's Vice Chair will organize efforts to begin the nomination process to replace Members at Large whose terms will end in June of this year.
 - St Therese needs to replace two members.
 - St Vincent Pallotti had one person's term ending but that person will continue for another term.
- The next PPC meeting is scheduled for February 4 at St Therese in Miriam's Corner.

Prayer & Worship Committee

Although the Prayer and Worship Committee did not formally meet during the month of December, we hope you took the opportunity for prayer during this joyous season. The Christmas celebrations were beautiful and included a Children's Choir at St. Therese this year, as well as at St. Vincent Pallotti.

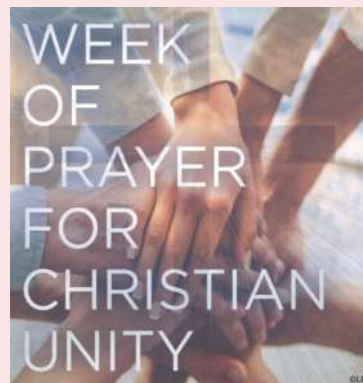

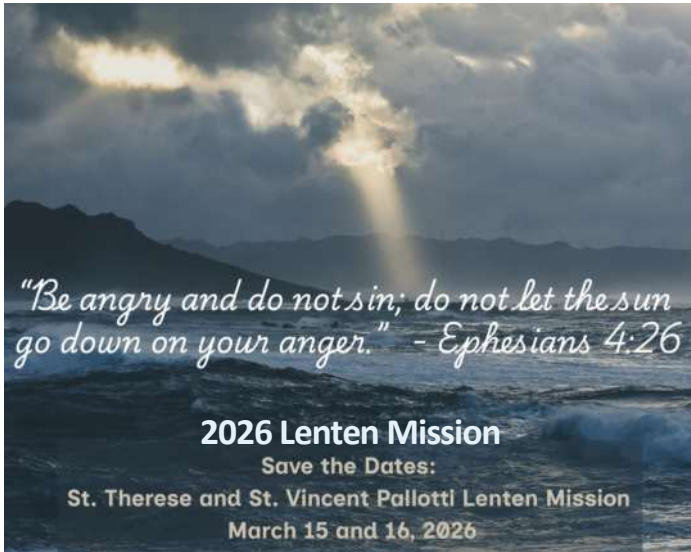

From The Earth Ministry: Eco-Friendly Deicing



In winter, we try to keep our roadways, driveways and walkways free of snow and ice. The most plentiful and cheapest way to melt snow and ice is to use rock salt (sodium chloride) or its "cousin" compound, calcium chloride. These two chlorides damage concrete, and the runoff or spray is harmful to trees, plants and animals. With the spring thaw, our lakes and streams receive concentrations that are harmful to plankton and fish. It is estimated that 2.2 billion pounds of chlorides wash into Lake Michigan annually.

Some eco-friendly "home remedies" as alternatives to purchasing commercially-made deicers, include:

- Shoveling - The best deterrent to ice is to shovel as soon after a snowfall as possible to allow the sunshine to dry out surfaces and avoid ice build-up.
- Sand or Kitty Litter – Provide traction and for sand, a great way to use up excess from a sandbox.
- Wood By-products – Wood shavings and sawdust from your workshop provide traction. So does ash from last night's fire. Ash also darkens the surface, attracting heat from the sun for melting.
- Coffee grounds – Sprinkling used grounds will help speed melting and provide some traction. This does not work very quickly, so it is best done when temperatures aren't too low and the sun is shining.

If you use the home remedies above, make sure you have adequate step-off mats, rugs or a shoe rack at your entry doors.

In a subsequent article, we will discuss commercially available icers that ARE eco-friendly and not harmful to plants and animals.

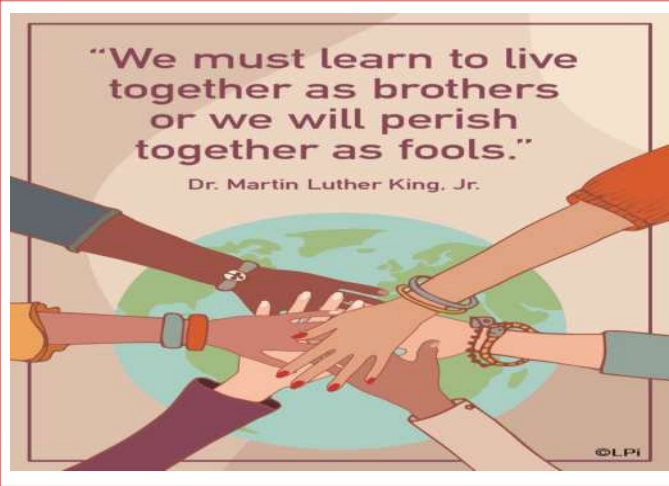

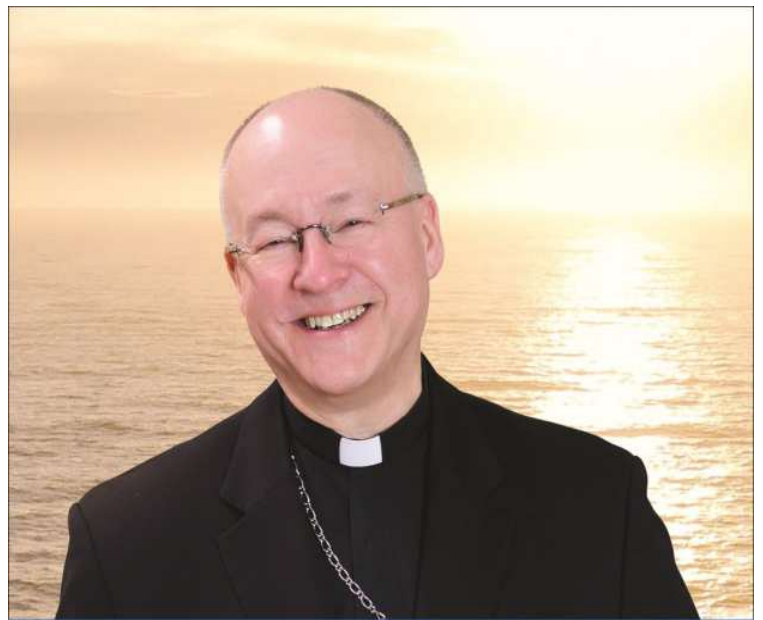

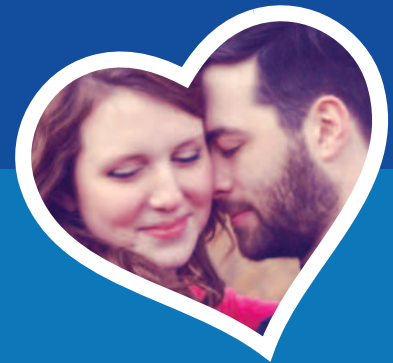
