



6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:17-37

A few years into my priesthood, I hit a wall. I had taken on too many commitments: Masses, meetings, ministries, projects. I couldn't keep up. I was double-booking, forgetting things, running late, and letting people down. My boss at the time, a wise priest, and our shared secretary, noticed. For my birthday, the two gave me a stack of 100 flashcards, each with one word printed in a different language: "NO." It was funny, but also painfully true. If I couldn't say no, my yes was in danger.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says, **"Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the Evil One"** (Matthew 5:37). He's not just giving advice about polite speech. He's showing us something about the freedom of Christian discipleship. The follower of Christ is called to speak clearly, simply, and honestly. There is joy in that kind of freedom.

The Church Fathers often linked this kind of straightforward truthfulness with spiritual maturity. The devil is the father of lies, but Jesus is the Word made flesh. When we hedge, flatter, exaggerate, or avoid, we open space for the shadows to creep in. That little stack of flashcards reminded me that God does not want us enslaved to the expectations of others or to the fear of disappointing them. He wants us to enjoy the peace of saying yes and meaning it, and saying no, and meaning it, too.

Lenten Challenge: Practice one moment of honest, peaceful speech this week. Maybe it's a sincere "yes" to something important, or a humble "no" to something you cannot do. Let it be a quiet step into the freedom Jesus offers. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi



Prayer & Worship Committee

Some ideas are familiar activities we could extend to the greater community like; our pet blessing, our Thanksgiving Ecumenical service, and our Lenten Mission. From The Earth Ministry: Gas vs. Electric Stoves: Safety, Health, and Environmental Impact



According to Popular Mechanics (Nov 10, 2023) electric stoves are better for the environment and for indoor air quality and health. Gas stoves produce emissions and pollutants within your home, including methane and nitrogen oxides even when not in use, and carbon dioxide when in use. These contribute to lung problems and to climate change.

Regarding safety, gas stoves and lines can leak gas, and there is risk with open flames. Electric stoves cause cooking fires by unattended cooking, or being left on after use. Both can cause burns from their hot cooking surfaces. Induction cookstoves, a newer form of electric cooking, does not have home emissions or cause burns from their surface. They heat the food and thereby the pot but the cooking surface stays cool.

Gas stoves are not environmentally friendly, releasing CO2 and methane in your home. Electric stoves also have environmental issues as they might get their energy from fossil fuels, but leave their emissions at the power plant and not your kitchen. Even better, they can be powered by renewable sources of electricity.


If your kitchen is set up for natural gas cooking and you wish to change to electric, the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 offers rebates and tax credits to help offset the cost.

Devotions, Explained!

Stations of the Cross

In the earliest years of Christianity, the locations central to the story of Holy Week — the Garden of Gethsemane, Calvary, the Holy Sepulcher, and more — were destinations for pilgrims who wanted to experience Christ's sacrificial love for us in a physical way. In the years after the Crusades, pilgrimage to the Holy Land became impossible for most Christians, and the Stations of the Cross was popularized as a devotional means to pray through the passion and death of Christ.

Throughout history the number of stations has varied, with different traditions focusing on different events. In the 18th century, the number was officially fixed at 14 by Pope Clement XII. These stations are taken from the Gospel accounts of Christ's passion and death, though there are several which are derived from tradition and apocryphal sources, such as the meeting of Mother and Son and St. Veronica wiping the face of Christ. ©LPi



Virtues, Explained!


Gentleness

As followers of Christ, we are commanded to “always be prepared to offer an explanation ... to justify the hope that is in you.”

But the success of that evangelism hinges entirely on the very next instructions this passage contains: “However, do so with gentleness and respect” (1 Peter 3:15).

The word “gentleness” has come to be associated with softness and fragility — but there is no virtue that requires greater strength. As one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit, gentleness disposes us to receive the inspirations of the Spirit, who “reveals to men who Jesus is” (CCC 152). In cultivating a spirit of gentleness, we more closely resemble Christ, who was unfailingly gentle, even in the face of violence and death.

“Every virtue is a good thing, but most of all gentleness and meekness,” said St. John Chrysostom. “This shows us men; this makes us to differ from wild beasts; this fits us to vie with Angels.” ©LPi

You're Invited: Men of Christ Conference






