

2nd Sunday of Lent

Matthew 17:1-9

When I sit down to answer emails or write a Gospel reflection or return a phone call, I sometimes wonder: Does any of this humdrum work matter? Maybe you ask the same thing about your daily labor. Today's Gospel, the Transfiguration, offers a surprising answer.

Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a mountain. There, **“his face shone like the sun face and his clothes become white as light” (Matthew 17:2)**. That detail regarding his clothes is worth considering.

We know Jesus' body is inseparably united to the divine nature. But his clothing? That's something made by human hands. It's an artifact. And yet it shines with the same uncreated light. What does this detail mean? The early Church noted that Adam and Eve's first act after the Fall was to make clothing. This clothing symbolizes all human labor that supports our dignity. In Jesus' glorified garments, we see not just the redemption of our body, but of human effort to protect and uplift human dignity.

Parents, your family is your work. Baristas, plumbers, nurses, accountants — your labor, your emails, your phone calls, your spreadsheets — can all become radiant when offered to God in love. The question isn't just do I believe in Jesus' glory, but do I believe he can share it with the work of my hands?

Lenten Challenge: Identify the “artifact” you are making to uplift the dignity of others: your job, your home, your relationships. Consciously bring it to the Lord this Sunday at Mass. Offer it to share in His glory. It will begin to shine. — *Father John Muir* ©LPI





From The Earth Ministry:

This week's Lenten *metanoia* invitation:

Water is life. "...and the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters. . . And God said, 'Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear'. . . and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good.'" (Genesis:2,9-10)

"The water I shall give will become a spring of water welling up to eternal life." (Ez:1-12) (Jn 4:14)

This Week's Vision: Water. It is fundamental, nourishing all living organisms. It covers 71% of the Earth's surface. And makes up about 60% of the human body. From rivers to aquifers, oceans to lakes, water sustains us. But despite its necessity, this critical resource is currently threatened by pollution, with climate change and overuse impacting its global supply.

Lent is a call to reflect on our responsibility to water. Although we live surrounded by the fresh water of the Great Lakes, people in Africa walk an average of four miles every day to secure clean water for their families. Gratitude is grace.

Action Change: Conservation efforts like harvesting and reducing waste are needed to protect this limited resource. Strategies to protect water include reducing waste during daily activities (e.g., bathing), reusing water for gardening, and harvesting rain. Here's a simple one to get started:

Save the tap water you run until hot for dishwashing or scrubbing floors by directing it into a watering can rather than letting it go down the drain. Then use the collected water to nourish your houseplants.

Old-fashioned Penalty Penance: Install a rain barrel to water garden and lawn.

13 Years Without Food or Water, Just the Eucharist...
The Story of Blessed Alexandrina da Costa

This incredible Portuguese mystic, often called a “Victim Soul,” lived a life of extraordinary suffering united to Christ. At just 14, she jumped from a window to protect her purity from lustful attackers, resulting in irreversible paralysis that left her bedridden for over 30 years.

From 1938–1942, she mystically relived Christ’s Passion every Thursday night into Friday, enduring the

agony of the Crucifixion in her body for the conversion of sinners.

Then came her greatest miracle: Starting in 1942, she survived 13 years and 7 months on nothing but daily Holy Communion—no food, no water—while weighing as little as 73 lbs. Doctors were baffled, but she smiled through it all, saying Jesus wanted her heart full of suffering yet her lips smiling.

She offered everything for souls, echoing Fatima’s call to reparation. Her tombstone bears her own words: “Sinners, if the dust of my body can be of help to save you, come close, walk over it, kick it around until it disappears. But never sin again: do not offend Jesus anymore! ... Love Jesus, love him!”

She died on October 13, 1955 (anniversary of Fatima’s Miracle of the Sun), whispering, “I am happy, because I am going to Heaven.”

Beatified by St. John Paul II in 2004. What an example of love through suffering!

If this witness has touched your heart, consider offering a small prayer today for the conversion of sinners, in union with the sufferings of Blessed Alexandrina Maria da Costa. May her example help us love Jesus more deeply and live our faith more sincerely.

Lenten Observances for Fast and Abstinence

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent:



FAST

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent.
- Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one’s 59th birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
