



4th Sunday of Lent

John 9:1-41

If you are like me, it's easy to fixate on our shadows: failures, guilt, shame. Especially when we suffer, it is easy to want to blame ourselves or others. In this week's Gospel, Jesus' disciples ask about the blind man, "**Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents?**" (John 9:2) They, like us, focus on blame. But Jesus sees the entire situation differently: "**Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him.**" He does not deny sin, but he sees deeper — through the light of mercy, not the lens of judgment. The scene hinges on Jesus' strange claim: "**I am the light of the world**" (John 9:5). He sees things differently than everyone. They see shadows and light. He is the light.

Thought experiment: imagine you are the sun looking at everything on the earth. What do you see? Everything. What do you not see? Shadows. Everything is illuminated. If you see it, it is illuminated. For the light, nothing is dark.

Because He is the light, Jesus sees us in the glow of His redemptive love. Even our sin becomes a place where His glory can shine. The man's healing is not just about sight — it is about seeing as Christ sees. Lent is not a season of staring into darkness. It is a time to step into the light — to let Christ's gaze reframe how we see ourselves and one another.

Lenten challenge: Spend 10 quiet minutes this week asking Jesus to show you how He sees you. Not through shame or fear, but through the light of His mercy. — *Father John Muir* ©LPI

Trustee-Secretary Elections at Annual Meeting

The election of the Trustee-Secretaries for both St. Therese and St. Vincent Pallotti Parishes will take place at this year's Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 3. Ann Maher has agreed to be Fr. PC's nominee for the St. Therese Trustee-Secretary position for another two-year term of office beginning July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2028. Fr. PC will confirm his nominee for St. Vincent Pallotti shortly.

If you are interested in the position of Trustee-Secretary at either Parish, candidates must be nominated, in writing, by 10 or more parish members. A nomination and signature form is available in the Parish Office for anyone who wishes to put their name in nomination. Any active, registered, fully-initiated parish member, at least 25 years of age, is eligible to run for Trustee-Secretary.

According to Wisconsin State Statute 187.19, "trustees are to be selected from and by the congregation." Among other duties, the Trustee Secretary serves as an ex-officio member of the Parish Pastoral Council, the Finance Council, is a member of the Board of Directors of the parish corporation, signs proxy documents and all corporate reports, and signs parish checks with Trustee Treasurer, and the Parish Director.

Nominations will close on Sunday, April 19. The election will take place at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 3.

From The Earth Ministry:

This week's Lenten *metanoia* invitation:

Food is Life. "Gather the food pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted" (*John 6:12*).

This Week's Vision: Food comes from God's creation: land, sea and air. Yet, the average American wastes 4 to 6+ pounds of edible food **per week**, increasing their grocery costs. Most wasted food is sent to landfills, where it generates methane, a potent greenhouse gas.

Action Changes: Plan your weekly meals. Have a menu and grocery shopping list, buying only what you need. Avoid bulk food purchases or share them with family/neighbors. Embrace imperfect produce. Fruits and veggies with blemishes still taste the same and may cost less.

Store food properly. Keep milk and other quick-perishable foods at the back of the refrigerator where it is colder—not in the convenient door shelf. It will last longer and you'll save money.

Don't confuse "Sell by" and "Best if used by" dates with "Use by" dates. Look at and smell the food for signs of spoilage before tossing it. Access the USDA FoodKeeper App ([foodsafety.gov](https://www.foodsafety.gov)) for best food storage times for every food.

Love your leftovers. Develop recipes or menus around leftovers, whose mellowed flavors sometimes taste better than the original. Use glass containers rather than plastic if available. Freeze food that can't be eaten immediately. Repurpose food scraps for stocks (e.g., chicken bones, veggie skins) or smoothies (peelings, etc.).

Compost egg shells, produce waste, coffee grounds, etc. Or use an easy "dig-and-drop" method: Dig a 6-8 inch hole in the garden; drop scraps in; cover. Worms crave banana peelings. Dug in only 2", they will quickly disappear and increase their natural fertilizer from worm castings.

Positive Penance: In response to the food desert on Milwaukee's North side, Tricklebee Café at 4424 W. North Ave now has a Community Fridge which accepts food donations from the public (11:00AM – 2:00PM, Wednesday – Saturday). Just walk in and put extra produce in the refrigerator. Use sealed containers for soup and leftovers, marked with content and date. Served food there is free to diners with a donation of cash or work. See tricklebeecafe.org for details.

Just like the Loaves and Fishes, your shared food will multiply. Generosity is grace.



St. Patrick | March 17

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ. ©LPi





Lenten Observances for Fast and Abstinence

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent:



FAST

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat each Friday of Lent.
- Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Good Friday. Hence, on that day they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during that day. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
