Second Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

John 20:19-31

“Then he said to Thomas, ‘Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.’” (John 20:27)

In my early 20s, I volunteered at a parish youth group. I witnessed teens encountering Jesus with a fresh, romantic wonder that reminded me of my own teenage conversion. But something had changed in me. I was quietly jaded and cynical. When teens shared stories of encountering Christ, I'd want to sarcastically murmur, “Well, good for you.” I had grown suspicious of the zeal I once knew.

Then we brought the group on a pilgrimage. I was standing in an old church in France, ignoring a long-winded tour guide. I found myself before a crucifix. In that moment, I heard something, not audibly, but unmistakably in my heart: “I came to be your friend... and you wish to be my enemy? Why do you stand far from me? I suffer gladly for you. I was pierced for you. Why do you run from me?” My heart opened. I saw how cold and cynical I had become. But Jesus had not given up on me. He had returned, and His mercy broke through.

So I can relate to the scoffing — and transformation — of Thomas when the Risen Jesus presents his wounds for inspection. Thomas is not simply doubting; he is guarded, suspicious, even cynical. But Jesus comes to him. No lecture. Just understanding and mercy. He invites Thomas to touch his wounds. This burns away his cynicism like the morning mist.

Divine Mercy Challenge: This week, rejoice with someone who is newly alive in faith. If your own heart has grown skeptical or tired, ask Jesus to help you. He will. — *Father John Muir* ©LPI

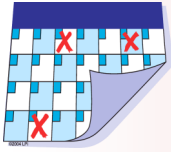

Trustee-Secretary Elections at Annual Meeting

The election of the Trustee-Secretaries for both St. Therese and St. Vincent Pallotti Parishes will take place at this year's Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 3. Ann Maher has agreed to be Fr. PC's nominee for the St. Therese Trustee-Secretary position for another two-year term of office beginning July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2028. Lenny Schaefer has agreed to be Fr. PC's nominee for the St. Vincent Pallotti Trustee-Secretary position for another two-year term of office beginning July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2028.

If you are interested in the position of Trustee-Secretary at either Parish, candidates must be nominated, in writing, by 10 or more parish members. A nomination and signature form is available in the Parish Office for anyone who wishes to put their name in nomination. Any active, registered, fully-initiated parish member, at least 25 years of age, is eligible to run for Trustee-Secretary.

According to Wisconsin State Statute 187.19, "trustees are to be selected from and by the congregation." Among other duties, the Trustee Secretary serves as an ex-officio member of the Parish Pastoral Council, the Finance Council, is a member of the Board of Directors of the parish corporation, signs proxy documents and all corporate reports, and signs parish checks with Trustee Treasurer, and the Parish Director.

Nominations will close on Sunday, April 19. The election will take place at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 3.

Pastoral Council Nominations Now Open

The Parish Pastoral Council includes the Pastor, the Trustees, and members at large. Member-at-large terms are three years (July 1–June 30), and terms are staggered so new members are added each year.

This year, three member-at-large terms end June 30. We are seeking three new members at large to begin July 1:

- Two from St. Therese
- One from St. Vincent Pallotti

You may nominate yourself or nominate another parishioner.

Nomination deadline: May 15. After nominations close, the Parish Pastoral Council will follow our normal discernment and selection process to confirm the new members.

Safe Environment Program – Did You Know...

In 2025, in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, over 155 Safe Environment Education Sessions were conducted with over 2,000 adults trained in identifying signs of abuse and neglect, over 7,500 criminal background checks were conducted on clergy, employees, and volunteers, and about 42,000 children were trained in Safe Environment topics. Every year in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, each parish and school are required to complete a report documenting their compliance with the Safe Environment Program's policies and procedures. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee Safe Environment Office used those reports to compile an archdiocesan report for USCCB audit firm Stonebridge Partners on our archdiocesan compliance with the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee has been found complaint every year since 2004.

Divine Mercy Sunday

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.



Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come.” ©LPi

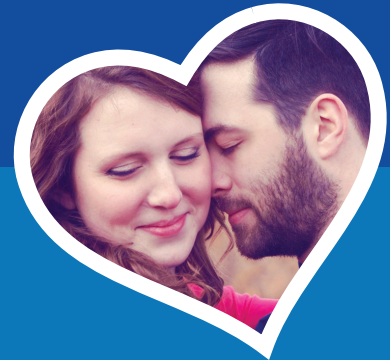
