



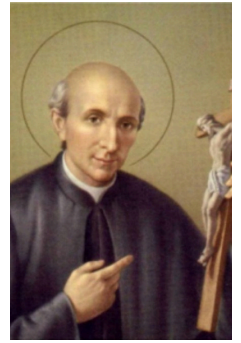

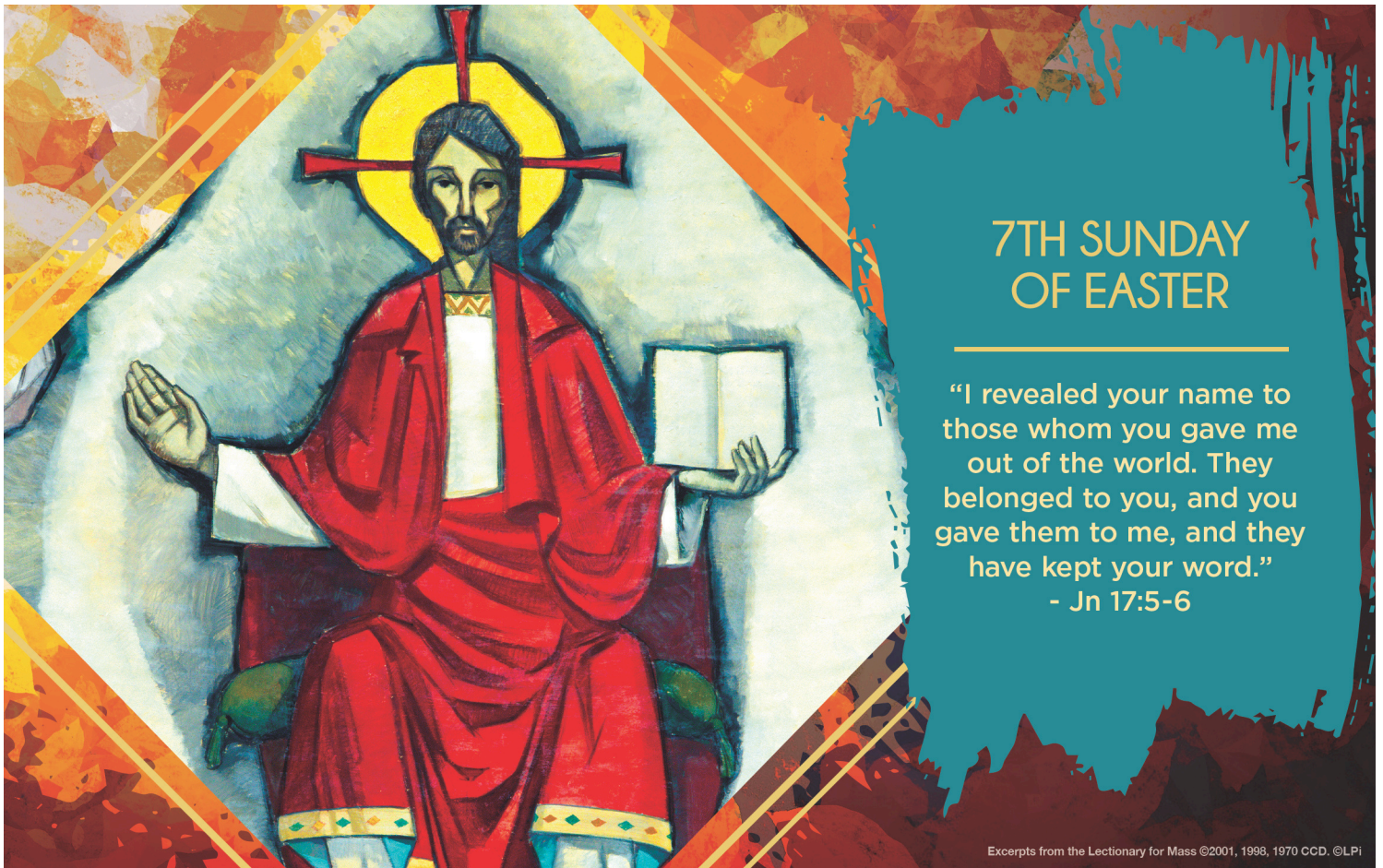

The Ascension of the Lord/7th Sunday of Easter

John 17:1-11a

Not long after my brother's first child was born, a beautiful little girl named Mary Elise, I asked him what it was like. Was he nervous? Overwhelmed? He said, “When I first held her, I was in such shock. I think I just said, ‘I am your dad. I am your dad.’” That moment marked a deep transformation for him. He was not just holding a baby; he was stepping into a new identity. Over the years, I have seen him live his fatherhood with quiet sacrifice, joy, and faithfulness. It started with that moment of truth.

This, I propose, is a glimpse of what Jesus means when He prays, “**Consecrate them in the truth.**” (John 17:17) To be consecrated is to be set apart in love, not taken out of the world. Consecration sends us into it with a new identity, always one that binds us to Him and to others in love. Our bond to Jesus and others is the deep truth that He continually renews.

Whenever we speak deep truths about ourselves, we experience this renewal: “I have sinned;” “I need help;” “I forgive you;” “I take you as my husband;” “I believe in one God...” Whether in confession, in the liturgy, or in a recovery group, truth heals and transforms. And the deepest truth of all? That we belong to the Risen and Ascended Christ. Our lives are no longer just ours. We are His and He is ours.

Name one truth you need to step into more deeply, about yourself, someone else, or God. Maybe put it on a note on your mirror. Let that truth consecrate you this week. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

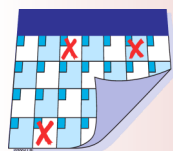

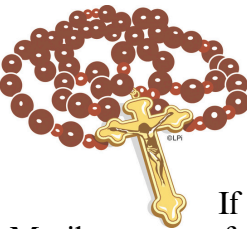

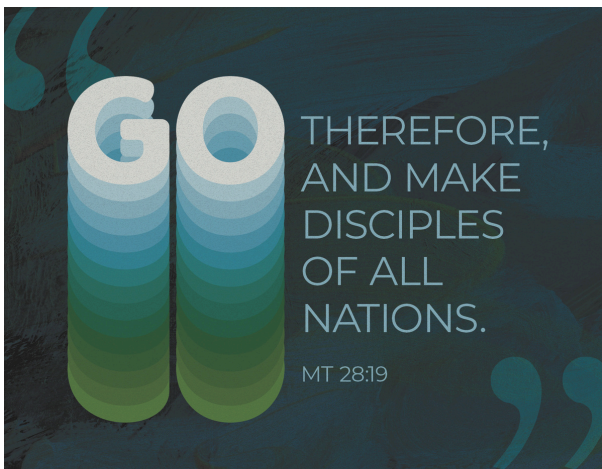
ASCENSION of the Lord



Couldn't Jesus have done more good if He stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

This is an interesting question! During His earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what He could have done if He'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In His place, Jesus says, He will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders He has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and His Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and He is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good He does here on earth! ©LPi



From The Earth Ministry:
Are Bamboo Products Sustainable?
Bamboo has a lot of positive qualities, but what are the concerns with bamboo? Bamboo requires processing



to turn it into useful products. This processing involves water, and care must be made to recycle the water and return it to the environment in good condition. Chemicals can be harmful and need to be disposed of properly. There are transportation and logistics costs to get the bamboo to processing and to the consumers. Bamboo grows so well that it can become invasive if left to grow unchecked. If allowed to take over large areas by itself, the monoculture damages biodiversity. These are drawbacks, but even poorly managed bamboo products are usually better for the environment than the equivalent product made of plastics or other synthetics. At this point, using bamboo products costs more than the substitutes. Will we pay more to protect our earth?

As an aware and ecological-minded consumer, you will want to know that the bamboo products you buy are ethically grown, harvested and manufactured. There are certifications on labels to help determine that. Four of the larger and better known certifying organizations for fabrics are GOTS, Fair Trade, Better Cotton, and Blue Sign.

Committee Reports

Prayer & Worship Committee

As the Easter season is winding down, the Prayer and Worship Committee reviewed some of the celebrations that took place. The Triduum was fairly well attended even though we had inclement weather. The Easter morning celebrations were joyful at all three sites.

Also on our agenda was the combined Parish annual meeting which was held at St. Therese Parish in Heck Hall after a 10:00am Mass. It was a very important meeting to discuss the future of our parish. Tom Barth, our chairperson, prepared an excellent explanation of how the Prayer and Worship members from each site have been working successfully at combining our resources.

Finally, we discussed the Corpus Christi celebration and procession which we hope to make an annual event. Since Corpus Christi lands on the same weekend as St. Vincent Pallotti parish picnic this year, it was determined and approved by Fr. Tom P.C. that we should combine these events on June 7. It will begin with a 10:00am Mass at the East site, followed by a procession around the grounds. It will conclude with a final service in the church. All will be invited to the picnic.

As we look forward to summer, remember to lift your hearts in grateful prayer for the beauty of the new season.

Stewardship Committee

May is a month in which we honor Mother Mary. She dedicated her life to obedience, humility and complete trust in God. That's a tall order for us as flawed human beings. Since this is also the month associated with Spring and new life, it could be a time for us to begin anew as well. We can reevaluate our commitment to the time and treasure we give to the Parish, pray for the well-being of our parish members, and support the decisions ahead.

Parish Pastoral Council

Council discussed the results of the Combined Annual Parish Meeting that was held on May 3. Attendance was 100 plus, and Father PC's "View of the Future" seemed to be well accepted. Father Nathan's explanation of the process to move forward with Merger was much appreciated. Father PC thanked everyone for their efforts in making this a successful meeting.

Council spent time discussing the next steps to move the Merger Process forward and the first Steering Committee meeting was on May 11 with the Archdiocese attending.

Council was updated on the progress of combining into one Parish Office by July 1.

Council was updated on progress to filling the open positions on the Combined Parish Pastoral Council. St Therese has one nominee for the two open positions at this point and needs one more nominee to maintain its 4 members at large on the council.

The Council was provided with another article on how some churches are gaining membership with younger people. Liaisons were advised to pass the article down to the Standing Committees as we need everyone's involvement in growing our membership.

Christian Formation reported that we will continue with St Jude in providing the young folks with their education. This will be the first year we have sacramental activity through the St Jude program.

Stewardship Committee has a new Chairperson, Kathy Czaplewski, but is still looking for more members.

Human Concerns Committee now has filled its Vice Chairperson and Secretary positions.

Final Budgets will be presented to the Parish Pastoral Council at the June 3 Council meeting which will be in Miriam's Corner at St Therese.

Devotions, Explained! – Hail Mary

The words of the Hail Mary — undoubtedly the most recognizable Catholic prayer after the Lord's Prayer — are deeply rooted in scripture. The opening lines of the prayer are taken from the words of the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation — "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." This line is known as the Angelic Salutation. The following words — "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus" — echo the sentiments expressed by Elizabeth at the Visitation.

The Angelic Salutation is regarded as the earliest devotional prayer to Mary, since it forms the very first words spoken to her as the Mother of God, but Catholics did not begin to utilize the Hail Mary prayer in its current form until around the 11th century. An in-depth explanation of each line of this prayer is provided in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2676-2677. ©LPi

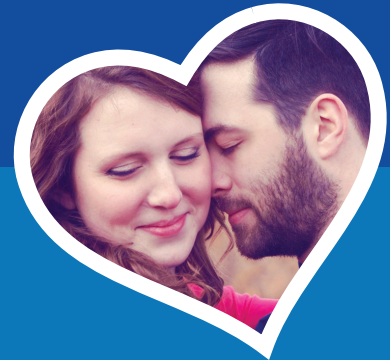
