Matthew 10:26-33

Jean Améry, a Holocaust survivor tortured by the Nazis, later wrote about the abyss of human evil. He described his reaction as an “indignant despair.” Haven’t we all, to some degree, felt that abyss opened beneath us? A sudden loss, a violent headline, a moment of loneliness or panic, when the world feels fragile and meaning seems to collapse?

It is to this fear that Jesus speaks in today’s Gospel: “Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body.” (Matthew 10:28) He does not deny evil or pretend we will never suffer. Instead, He reframes the abyss: do not fear those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Your life is seen, known, and counted by the Father. Even the hairs of your head, even the sparrow’s fall. This is no superficial comfort. Jesus himself has entered the abyss: suffering, death, even our sense of forsakenness, and he has come through it. That is why his words, “Do not be afraid,” hold such weight. They do not erase the abyss but build a bridge across it.

Faith is not pretending everything is fine. It is staring into the abyss and still choosing trust. And in that trust, we discover we are never alone. Christ stands with us, and the Father’s care surrounds us. That is the only comfort deep enough for our (often fearful) hearts. — *Father John Muir* ©LPI

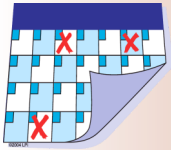

From the Earth Ministry: Beverage Container Options

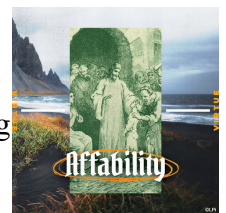
As temperatures move upward during the summer, so does our consumption of beverages to quench our thirst. For beer and non-alcoholic beverages, 40% of annual sales occur between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

Our Earth is being smothered with an ever-increasing amount of plastic, of which many of today's “vessels” are made. The world currently produces more than 414 metric tons of plastic each year. At the current rate, the amount of plastic created is expected to triple by the year 2050. Scientists have identified more than 3,200 toxins either present in plastic or released by the production of plastic. Only 5 – 6% of all plastic is recycled for use in new products, so the majority of what we diligently discard in municipal recycle bins ends up being warehoused or most often worse -- in landfills. Sadly, the production versus recycle rates clearly show we cannot “recycle our way out” of the plastics problem.

Compared to the dismal recycle percentage for plastic, nearly 60% of aluminum and glass “vessels” are recycled. Furthermore, recycled aluminum can be used multiple times to recreate the products from which it came originally, whereas this is most often not the case for recycled plastic. So purchase your favorite beverages in aluminum cans or glass bottles instead of plastic. But if you purchase plastic, please continue to recycle. 5-6% reclamation is better than nothing, and many experts believe that innovation and market demand will help this percentage increase in the future.

Virtues, Explained! Affability

There was a certain sister in the Carmelite convent who particularly tried the patience of St. Therese of Lisieux. But instead of avoiding this person, St. Therese instead made a point of smiling at her whenever the two met.



“Charity must not consist in feelings, but in works,” wrote St. Therese. “I set myself to doing for this Sister what I would do for the person I loved the most.” In doing so, she learned to see “Jesus hidden in the depths” of this woman's soul. St. Therese was growing in the virtue of affability when she did this. Affability is attached to justice, writes St. Thomas Aquinas, and demands “that we behave pleasantly to those among whom we dwell.” (Sum., II:II, 114, Art. 2)

In being affable, we make ourselves friendly, approachable, and agreeable to those around us, regardless of how they make us feel. “How good and how pleasant it is when brothers dwell together as one,” writes King David in Psalm 133. ©LPi

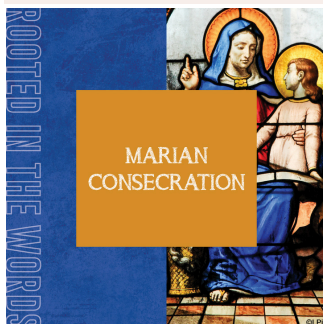

Parish Pastoral Council

- The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) met the St Therese nominee for one of the Member at Large positions. We continue to seek another volunteer as St Therese has one remaining open position.
- Council met with the Human Concerns Committee to get an update of what the committee has accomplished towards its Annual Plan and what assistance is needed from the PPC. PPC agreed to provide additional direction to improve the Human Concerns organization structure and communications with the PPC.
- Progress towards moving to the July 1 date of having one combined office at St Vincent Pallotti and what remains to be accomplished was discussed
- PPC was advised that the letter asking the Archbishop for approval to move forward with a merger between St Therese and St Vincent Pallotti had been delivered. We are expecting to hear from the Archdiocese before the end of June.
- Another article was provided to PPC members regarding people returning to church and how others are doing things to increase membership and community for their parishes. It was emphasized that our parishes need to develop a plan to increase our membership as our community is aging, and we need to attract more families to make us sustainable for the future.
- St Vincent Pallotti presented their budget. St Therese will do the same in August.
- Father PC emphasized that Council and all our organizations need to spend more time in prayer as we come together to perform our church activities
- We thank S.r Marilyn Metz and Tom Ratkowski for their time on the Council as their terms end on June 30.
- The next PPPC meeting is August 5 at 7:00pm in the Upper Room at Pallotti House. There is no meeting in July.

Devotions, Explained! – Marian Consecration



Marian consecration, the act of consecrating oneself to Jesus through the intercession of his Blessed Mother, is actually rooted in the words of Jesus himself when he beseeched the Apostle John to look upon Mary as his mother (John 19:27) and to "take her into his own home." He was actually instructing us all to do likewise—to "behold your mother" and take Mary into our hearts, for wherever she is beloved, Christ is known and praised. St. Maximilian Kolbe described Mary as "the stairway to Heaven." Marian consecration, therefore, could be likened to climbing the stairs. Different formulas exist for spiritual development in preparation for the consecration, based on the writings of saints like St. Louis de Montfort, and there are different prayers for the act of consecration. However, there is no "right" way to consecrate oneself to Jesus through Mary, so long as the ultimate goal is closeness to Christ and the glorification of God. ©LPi

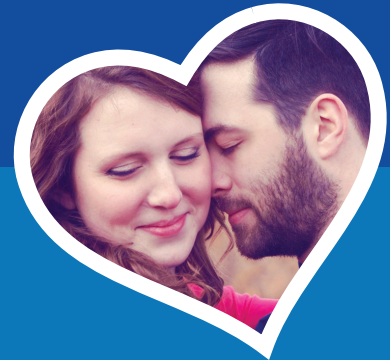
