



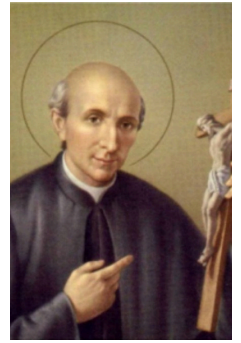

### 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

*Matthew 10:37-42*

I still remember the first homily I ever preached as a new deacon. It was at the seminary, and the Gospel was this one: **“Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me.”** (*Matthew 10:37-38*) Standing before more than 200 classmates and professors, I stumbled awkwardly through my words and realized how strange — almost insane — this teaching sounded. If anyone else said it, we would call it narcissistic or cultish. And that is the point. I felt the weight of those words in my own heart then, as I still do today. Am I willing to live as though Christ’s claim on my love is absolute? Are you?

Over the years, I’ve learned that the more I do, the more everything else makes sense. Family, friendships, vocation, even my very self: all of it falls into place when my love for Jesus comes first. That is why he dares to speak this way. Our Lord is not a cult leader hungry for control. He is the Son of God, the source of life and love itself. To put him before everything else is not to lose, but to find...everything, and everyone, in him.

This week, name one thing or one person you are tempted to place before the Lord. Then consciously offer it back to him in prayer. — Father John Muir ©LPi

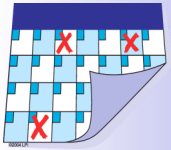

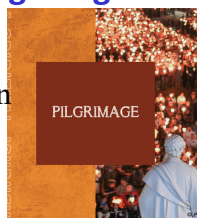

#### Devotions, Explained! – Pilgrimage

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to “a high mountain by themselves,” indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.



Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints. Some of the most iconic pilgrimage destinations include Fatima, Lourdes, and the Santiago de Compostela in Spain. ©LPi

#### From the Earth Ministry: Beverage Container Options

As temperatures move upward during the summer, so does our consumption of beverages to quench our thirst. For beer and non-alcoholic beverages, 40% of annual sales occur between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

Our Earth is being smothered with an ever-increasing amount of plastic, of which many of today’s “vessels” are made. The world currently produces more than 414 metric tons of plastic each year. At the current rate, the amount of plastic created is expected to triple by the year 2050. Scientists have identified more than 3,200 toxins either present in plastic or released by the production of plastic. Only 5 – 6% of all plastic is recycled for use in new products, so the majority of what we diligently discard in municipal recycle bins ends up being warehoused or most often worse -- in landfills. Sadly, the production versus recycle rates clearly show we cannot “recycle our way out” of the plastics problem.

Compared to the dismal recycle percentage for plastic, nearly 60% of aluminum and glass “vessels” are recycled. Furthermore, recycled aluminum can be used multiple times to recreate the products from which it came originally, whereas this is most often not the case for recycled plastic. So purchase your favorite beverages in aluminum cans or glass bottles instead of plastic. But if you purchase plastic, please continue to recycle. 5-6% reclamation is better than nothing, and many experts believe that innovation and market demand will help this percentage increase in the future.

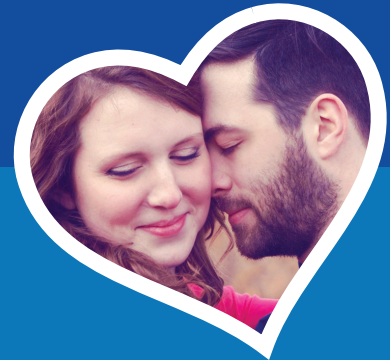
