17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 13:44-52

Around the time that the gold rushes ended in the nineteenth-century West, a curious phenomenon arose in New England known as money diggers. These were men who roamed the countryside with shovels, divining rods, and superstitious hope, convinced that treasure lay buried beneath their feet. Surely there must be gold under our feet. But there was not. The craze of these wild goose chases caused many to lose farms, families, and sanity.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus inaugurates a new era of spiritual money digging. He announces, "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field." He invites us to become treasure seekers who search in the right place. What is of greatest value is not money beneath our feet, but the infinite treasure hidden deep in the humanity of Jesus himself, God's own blessed life. The glory of heaven lies veiled in His ordinary life, His teaching, His suffering, His Church.

This teaching about the Kingdom changes things. Now we see the Church's doctrinal and moral teachings are not arbitrary rules. They are a treasure map. Follow them, and we will uncover divine happiness. Ignore them, and we will wander aimlessly, spade in hand, digging in empty fields, discouraged.

Where have we wasted energy seeking treasure in the wrong places? How have we given up on seeking the treasure of truly finding God's love for us? If so, let us repent of both. Then let us dust off our shovels and get back to digging deep into the field of Christ Jesus and His Church. After all, He never ceases seeking His treasure in us. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly – July 26

This weekend at Mass we will have a special blessing in honor of the 6th Annual World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. This year's theme is "I will never forget you" (Is 49:15).

This theme reminds us that God's unwavering love is the ultimate answer to the isolation and neglect so often experienced by the elderly. It brings comfort and hope, assuring us that the Lord knows each of us personally, forgets no one, and loves us unconditionally, even through the frailties of old age.

In 2021, Pope Francis established the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus (July 26). It is intended to be an opportunity to reflect on how the presence of grandparents and the elderly can become a sign of hope in every family and church community.

From the Earth Ministry:

In 2023 we encouraged use of eco-friendly alternatives to popular liquid or powdered laundry detergents. Waste water from popular-brand detergents contain several harmful chemicals, microfibers, plastic residue, and other nasty residues. Besides that, we mentioned that sustainable alternatives like laundry sheets or tablets (new since we last wrote) are packaged in biodegradable or recycled paper instead of non-recyclable plastic jugs some of which are like small barbells to lift from store and laundry room shelves.

When laundry sheets first came out, testing found that they didn't work as well as traditional detergents on stains or heavily soiled materials. However, this was not the case if these problem areas were sprayed with a pretreatment. More recently, testing laboratories have found no difference in cleaning power of some laundry sheet brands and the newer laundry tablets versus popular liquid or powder detergents.

We have recently switched from laundry sheets to tablets made by Blueland (www.blueland.com). It's amazing that such a small thing (about the size of two quarters on top of each other) can create clean clothes just as well as any of the commercially advertised detergents. Blueland products are available at Costco and other retail stores. Blueland also makes dishwasher and toilet cleaning tablets.

Laundry sheets and tablets are wonderful for travel. They are compact and won't accidentally soak items in your suitcase.

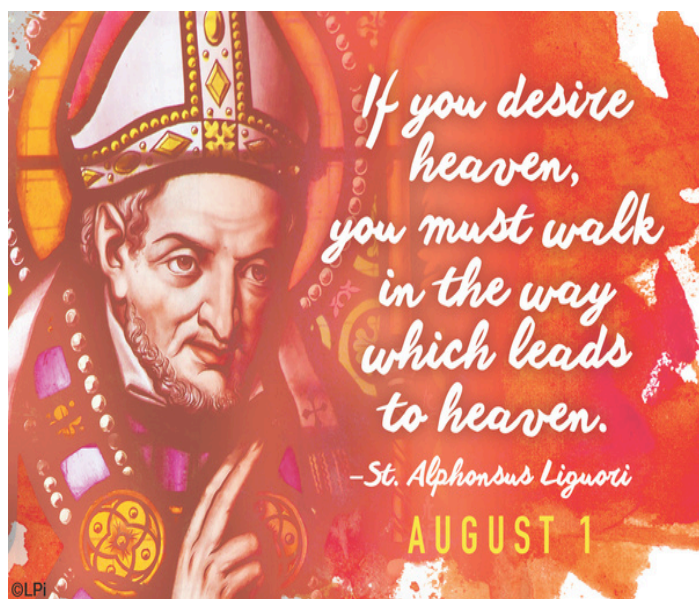

St. Alphonsus Liguori | August 1

Saint Alphonsus was born into a well-respected family in 1696, in Marianella, in the Kingdom of Naples. He received an exceptional education through private tutors and was conferred degrees in civil and canon law at 16. He practiced law for 8 years before he turned to the Church. He was ordained a priest in 1726.

Saint Alphonsus traveled for 26 years in the Kingdom of Naples preaching. His style of ministry was called “mission among the people,” he and a group of priests or lay brothers would go to rural areas, staying for a time to teach, preach, and pray with the people there.

Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher, he was able to connect with ordinary people and his teaching and sermons were marked by his compassion. In a time of restrictive Church rule, where fear of God was truly fear, Saint Alphonsus taught about God’s redeeming love. He also had a special devotion to Mary, praying to her for intercession and including devotions to her in his teaching. He wrote extensively, more than 100 books which have been through thousands of editions. His books are still available today and have been translated into more than 60 languages.

In 1762 Saint Alphonsus was made a bishop by Pope Clement XIII, however, he was eventually allowed to resign his post because of his ill health. He was paralyzed for a time from rheumatic fever in 1775, and had rheumatism so severe it was deforming, bending his head so far forward that his chin rested on his chest.

He died peacefully at the age of 90 in 1787. He was canonized in 1839 by Pope Gregory XVI, and in 1871 he was named a doctor of the church by Pope Pius IX. In 1950 he was declared patron of moral theologians by Pope Pius XII.

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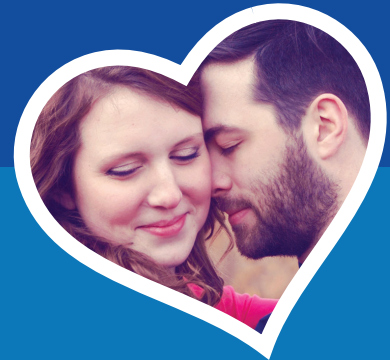
