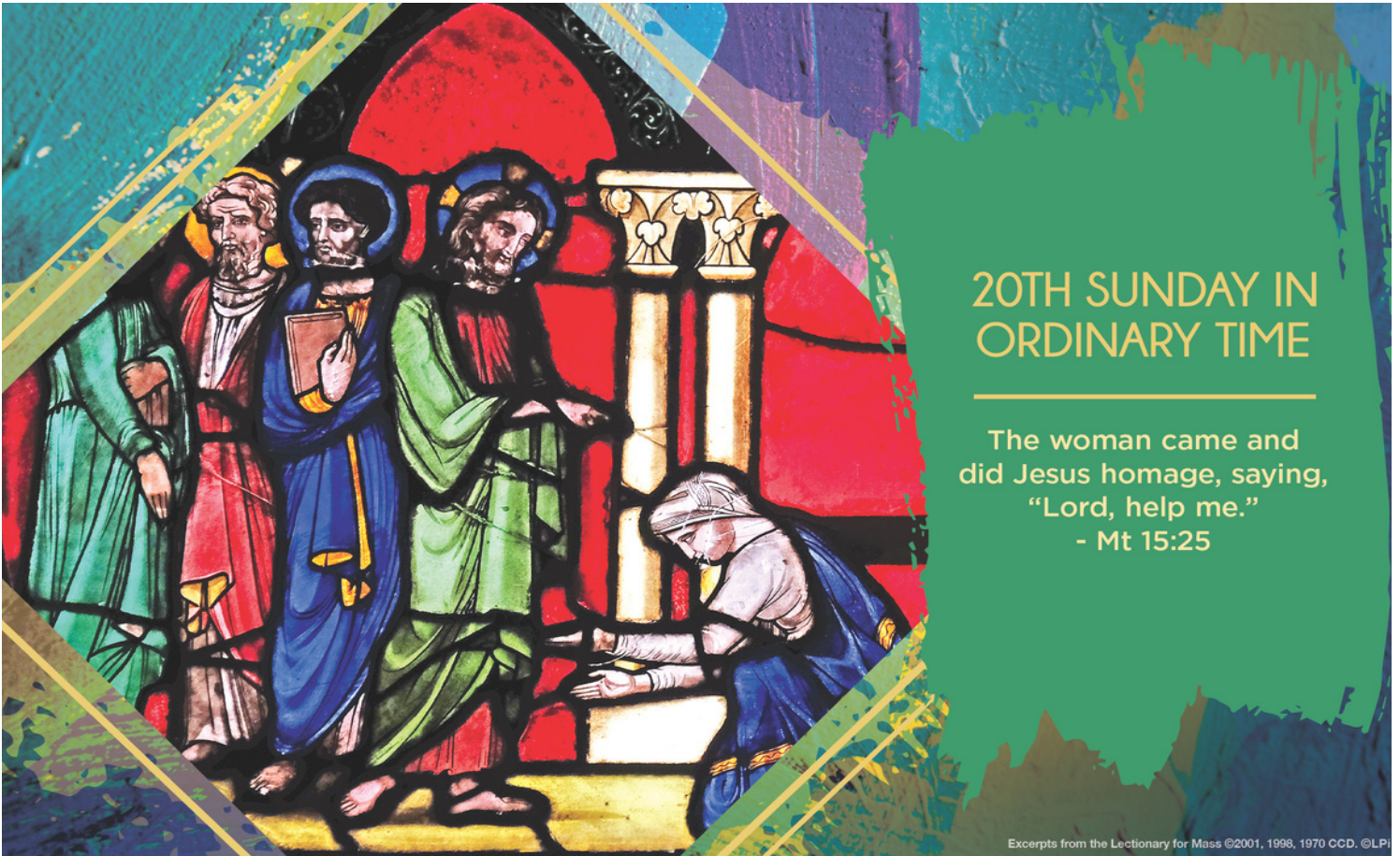

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 15:21-28

Does God ignore or act a bit rough with you? Jesus crosses the border into the pagan region of Tyre and Sidon, the territory long outside the covenant. There, a Canaanite woman calls out, **"Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David."** At first, He is silent. Then He rebuffs her. **"It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs."** But the Church Fathers saw this not as an insult but as an initiation. Christ draws out of her heart a deeper faith.

She presses on. **"Please, Lord, even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters."** Jesus' silence and response solidify her humility and trust. She thus becomes a model for prayer for centuries of Christians. St. Augustine said she shows how sinners come to grace by moving from silence to humility to perseverance.

This woman is the Church. She is you and me. She is every soul who dares to cry out from the margins, who endures divine silence until it turns to compassion. When Jesus says, **"O woman, great is your faith,"** it is the joyful cry of God discovering faith where the world least expects it. Even the smallest crumb of Your mercy, Lord, is enough to heal the soul. Do we have the courage to show faith like that? — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

Final Call: Merged Parish Name Suggestions

Thank you to those who have submitted names to consider for the new parish. If you haven't yet, there is still time. Please submit your name suggestion and a brief explanation for your suggestion to the Parish Office via email (heather@stthereseemke.org), mail, or by dropping them off at the office.

According to the Archdiocese, "The parish name must be a title of the Blessed Trinity, a mystery in the life of Christ, or a title already accepted in the liturgy, the Blessed Mother under a title already accepted in the liturgy, the Holy Spirit, one of the angels, or an approved saint. Preferably, the name is one not being used by any other parish in the Archdiocese."

Please pray about and discern your name suggestions. Read about some saints. You can start with the parish libraries. There is a lot of information on the internet. There are also many catholic publishers.

The submission period will remain open until Sunday, August 23. The Naming Team, the Parish Pastoral Council, and Fr. Tom PC will review the submissions and narrow them to a list of 10. The list will be shared with parishioners the weekend of August 29/30 and you can share your support for a particular name through Sunday, September 20. ***This will not be a voting process.*** The Naming Team, the Parish Pastoral Council, and Fr. Tom PC will review the parishioner responses. Fr. Tom PC will then decide on the final three names to be submitted to Archbishop Grob on September 23.

ADULT FORMATION Opportunities

Join us after Mass on August 22/23 for our next Fourth Sunday Formation session. This month's topic is Mass Stipends. Plan to stay after Mass for 10-15 minutes that weekend and learn more about the Catholic faith.

What is a Mass stipend? It is a set donation (currently \$20) for the priest to offer a Mass for a donor's intention. But it is more than a donation; it is a bond between the donor, the priest, and the altar. Each time we request a Mass, we participate more intimately with the celebration of the Mass. From the Earth Ministry:

Meatless Mondays is an international campaign to improve health and decrease the negative environmental effects that meat contributes in our food supply. There is a long history of the movement. Woodrow Wilson called for all meals every Monday and one meal of each day to be meatless during World War I. The campaign returned during World War II. These campaigns were for economic reasons.

Today the campaign is aimed at improving the health of people and the health of the environment. It is being promoted by the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health Center for a Livable Future. The program follows the nutrition guidelines developed by the USDA. Note this quote from the Johns Hopkins website: "The environmental impacts of industrial-style meat production include a strain on freshwater reserves, creation of greenhouse gas emissions that exacerbate climate change, an inefficient use of land, pollution from animal waste, deforestation, and significant loss of biodiversity." Summer Spiritual Day Trips

Visit the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist for a 9:00AM Sunday Mass. The cathedral is the mother church of the Archdiocese, so all Catholics are automatically members of the cathedral. It is good to have a sense and connection to the mother church.



How Many Times Can A Person Receive Holy Communion Each Day?

The Code of Canon Law (#917) stipulates, “A person who has received the Most Holy Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only during the celebration of the Eucharist in which the person participates, with due regard for the prescription of Canon 921, §2.” Following this lead, Canon 921, §2 stipulates, “Even if they have received Communion in the same day, those who are in danger of death are strongly urged to receive again.” Succinctly, a person may receive Holy Communion twice a day.



Given this citing of official Church law, we must appreciate the rationale that serves as its foundation. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the celebration of the Blessed Sacrament is “the true center of the whole Christian life both for the universal Church and for the local congregation of that Church” (*Instruction on the Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery*, #6). The offering of the Mass and the reception of Holy Communion are intrinsically connected. Moreover, the components of the Mass, particularly the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, form a cohesive whole.

Therefore, in ordinary circumstances, an individual is obligated to participate fully in the entire Mass making an offering of oneself to the Lord. The person ought to be present from the very beginning until the very end of the Mass, giving full attention as best one can. Such full participation and attention dispose the individual to receive Holy Communion. Worthy reception of Holy Communion not only enables the individual to enter into communion with the Lord, but also binds that individual in a communion of faith and love with the other members of the Church.

Never, in ordinary circumstances, do we isolate the reception of Holy Communion from the rest of the Mass. The Church grants the permission of receiving Holy Communion twice in one day to meet those situations of a person attending perhaps a wedding Mass and a funeral Mass on the same day, or attending the regular daily Mass and then some special Mass the same day; nevertheless, the stipulation is that the person attends the whole Mass in both instances.

Unfortunately, I have known individuals who on a daily basis just “pop” into Mass (even Masses) at the right time to receive Holy Communion and then leave before Mass concludes; it is almost like they are getting their “Jesus fix” for the day rather than worshiping God and wholeheartedly receiving the Blessed Sacrament.

As qualified in Canon 921, §2, in those special circumstances when a person is in danger of death, then he may receive Holy Communion as *viaticum* along with Penance and Anointing of the Sick, even though he may have received twice already that day. Another special circumstance arises when the person is confined in a hospital or homebound: here the person may receive outside the context of Mass, but would not receive more than once a day unless in danger of death.

Two other basic stipulations govern the reception of Holy Communion: First, a person who is conscious of mortal sin must first make a sacramental confession and receive absolution. If no legitimate opportunity exists for first going to confession, then a person may make an act of perfect contrition with the pledge to the Lord to go to Penance as soon as possible before receiving Holy Communion (*Code of Canon Law*, #916).

Second, a person must fast from food and drink (except water or medicine) for one hour beforehand (*Code of Canon Law*, #919). However, the period of fast before receiving Holy Communion is reduced to “approximately one quarter of an hour” for those who are sick at home or at a hospital, those elderly confined to home or a nursing home, and those who care for these people and who are unable conveniently to observe the fast (*Immensae Caritatis*, 1973).

The Church in her prudence provides these laws to help us have a balanced spiritual life, avoiding extremes. Just as the Church requires a person to receive Holy Communion at least once a year (the “Easter duty law”), so does the Church restrict the number of times we can receive a day.

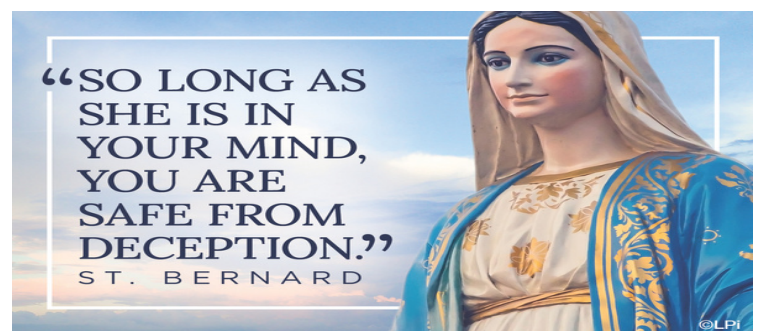

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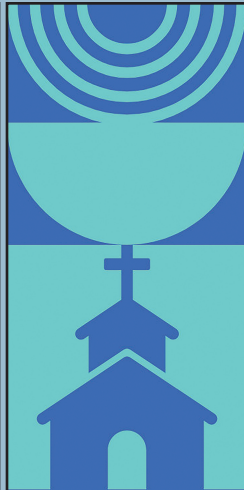
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
