26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 21:28-32

This Sunday, Jesus tells a short, uncomfortable story. A father asks two sons to go work in the vineyard. One says no, but later goes. The other says yes, but never shows up. It is a parable so simple, we almost miss how sharp it is. Jesus is clear about who it is for. This is not aimed at pagans or outsiders. It is aimed squarely at religious people, people who know the right words and sound obedient.

Jesus is not condemning unbelief so much as disobedience. The polite hypocrisy that says the right things while quietly resisting the Father's will. St. John Chrysostom put it bluntly, "Not words, but deeds, are what God requires. Nothing so exasperates Him as insincere obedience, while nothing so delights Him as repentance."

Every disciple must face that mirror. Do I publicly profess faith in Christ while privately resisting what He asks of me? It is easy to say, I believe in God in my heart. But if faith never becomes action, it slowly becomes an illusion.

Jesus does not expose hypocrisy to shame us. He reveals it to heal us. He wants our hearts and our deeds to speak the same word, to let our yes truly mean yes. Like the second son who initially refused but afterwards changed his mind and went, Jesus invites us to step into the Father's will, however late, however imperfectly.

Challenge: Where are your public faith and private obedience divided? Where do you say, I will go, but never enter the vineyard? Go, get to work, even if it is late. The Father's vineyard is still open. — Father John Muir ©LPI

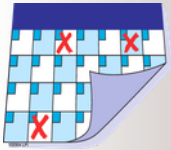

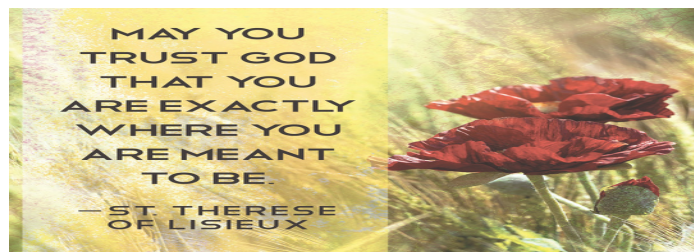

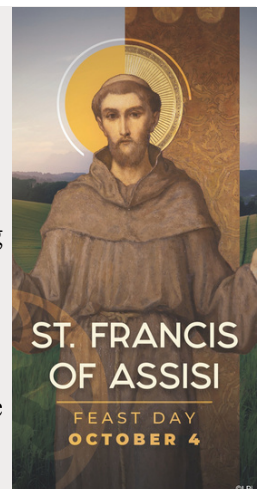

St. Francis of Assisi –Feast Day October 4

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226) left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land.

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith. Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day. ©LPi

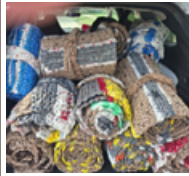


- *Theo of Golden* by Allen Levi – An inspirational bestseller. A great read that won't disappoint!

From the Earth Ministry: Mercy Mats

It is hard to believe that in this day and age there are homeless people including vets that need a warm and dry place to lay their head. You can make someone happy and comfortable plus keep plastic bags out of landfills or littering our environment. Mats for the homeless are made out of recycled light weight plastic grocery bags and colored newspaper bags. They are folded, cut into strips and then looped together to create PLARN (plastic yarn) that is used to crochet into mats that one can sleep on or wrap around themselves (see pictures).

It takes 500 to 700 bags to make a mat. You can help with this wonderful ministry by bringing your bags to church and putting them in the gray boxes at each vestibule door at both St Therese and St Vincent Pallotti. If you want to be more involved, go to the West Allis Library every Wednesday from 3:00 to 5:30pm; there a several women in the Craft Circle that prepare the bags for crocheting. If you have access to Facebook, search for Mercy Mats West Allis and learn more. The mats are beautiful.

What are Combined Collections?

Combined Collections is our twice-per-year involvement in the USCCB National Collections, which we refer to as "Combined Collections." What had been separate monthly second collections in previous years have been combined into two mailings a year — one in spring and one in fall.



Church in Latin America

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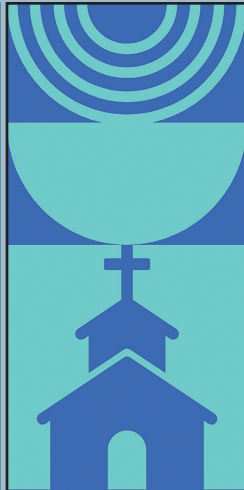
